There are so many school-boys who want to play Soccer in Frankston that local officials are embarrassed.


Norm Stanley, chairman of the Melbourne Metropolitan League Management Committee and also a Frankston Soccer Club official, is most concerned about the situation.

He said that this part of Victoria has probably the greatest potential for Junior Soccer players, but his club hasn't the officials nor the finance to cater for them.

Last year Frankston had 11 junior teams—the most run by a Victorian club.

And this season it could double, providing Frankston gets the help.

Mr Stanley said this week: "It's a great pity to have to turn all these keen boys away when they come and ask for a game, but we simply haven't got the officials or the finance to cater for them."
