.DATELINE SPAIN.

Last week England beat Spain. This week, Manchester United came up against REAL Madrid. Real Madrid - what names they conjure up! Distefano - Ruskas - Charmatin - You stop at the last one. Just who or what is Charmatin?

The many soccer connoisseurs who have seen matches in Madrid will agree that the famous Charmatin Stadium proves to be a startling spectacle. In size, it is second only to the huge stadium in Rio de Janeiro. The design is unusual, and, to visiting spectators and players, the stadium is forbidding, even terrifying. It is built in bullring style, in tiers, with the topmost spectators almost hanging over to look down onto the pitch. It is capable of holding about 140,000 and yearly improvements and additions will eventually bring the capacity to 200,000. There is a wide sweep of space around the playing pitch, which is normally in perfect condition, and a fitting arena on which the strutting, brilliant Spaniards play the football which earns them the idolation of their frenzied fans.

He soon came under the selectors eyes, and was selected for the left wing position in an F.A. Youth X1 trial.

On his arrival in Australia, two State League sides went after his services. George Cross proved to be lucky, and he has spent the past two seasons with them; until his transfer to Frankston this year.

Graham married shortly prior to his departure for Australia; he is now living in Frankston and is a guillotine and folding machine operator by trade. Just 21 years old, he is keen on most sports, but favours golf and swimming.
