

Report -

This fast, hard game was marred by tragic circumstances when Blues centre forward John Walton broke his leg midway through the second half. Frankston were pressing for an equaliser at the time, but with Finch and Mail injured at almost the same time and Frank Thompson already taken off with a back injury, we were probably lucky to only lose by two goals. The blues started off like league leaders and had control in midfield without really penetrating the Reds defence. Yallourn took the lead when their outside right headed in from close range. Frankston lost their poise after this but came back fighting in the second half until John Walton, through with only the keeper to beat collided with the Yallourn keeper with tragic results. This knocked the stuffing out of Frankston and it was no surprise when Yallourn scored a second goal late in the second half.

We are still getting players and two more have arrived from England. We seem to be lucky this way, having John Walton and Dave Morgan recently. The latest acquisitions are - Allan Parrott and Keith Lawson. Both come from Sutton in London and played for leading amateur side Sutton United. They have been in Australia six weeks and live in Chelsea.

Several efforts are being made by us and thankfully, the Yallourn club also, to help John Walton. The Yallourn club stated after the game last week that they would run a couple of raffles with all the proceeds going to John. A noble gesture indeed and we thank them heartily. This is true soccer spirit for a club to do this sort of thing when the responsibility is certainly not their own.

George Westlake behind the "bar" at the club also is running a weekly raffle for the same cause. By the way this was the third time in his career he has broken a leg and certainly a pity when we valued him highly among our players.

Approaching the half way stage now and we lie 2 points from the leaders. At this stage last year we were 3 points behind second place. We look to be in with a great chance besides our 7th position in the table. It takes 22 games to win the league and one never can tell what is ahead. A little bit of luck and tons of effort are what is required.
