

## ***Tommy makes it five wins in seven games***

MIDDLE PARK 4.9.82

FRANKSTON CITY PLAYING AWAY TO THE HIGHLY RATED YOUNG HELLAS-HAKOAH TEAM SNATCHED TWO VERY IMPORTANT POINTS AND COMPLETED THEIR FIRST LEAGUE DOUBLE OF THE SEASON AT MIDDLE PARK LAST SATURDAY.

HAVING PREVIOUSLY BEATEN HAKOAH 1-0 IN THE FIRST HALF OF THE SEASON AND WINNING FOUR OUT OF THEIR LAST SIX GAMES CITY HAD EVERY REASON OF FEELING CONFIDENT OF PICKING UP ANOTHER COUPLE OF VALUABLE POINTS.

THE MATCH BEGAN AT A FAIRLY QUICK PACE WITH BOTH TEAMS TESTING EACH OTHER OUT IN FRONT OF GOAL WITH HAKOAH VERY UNLUCKY NOT TO HAVE GONE ONE UP WHEN THEY HIT THE CROSSBAR IN THE EARLY STAGES AND AS WE WERE TO FIND OUT LATER IT WAS THEIR ONLY REAL CHANCE OF SCORING. WITH CITY STARTING TO PRESS FORWARD IT SEEMED THAT A GOAL WAS IMMINENT. AND IT CAME, WHEN THE BRILLIANT BUCHANAN WENT DOWN THE RIGHT ON ANOTHER OF HIS FAMILIAR STRONG RUNS, AFTER BEATING ONE OPPONENT BUCHANAN WENT TO THE BYE-LINE AND CUT THE BALL BACK TO THE SIX YARD BOX WHERE THE INCOMING GOLBY JUST FAILED TO REACH THE BALL AND IN DOING SO TOOK THREE OPPONENTS WITH HIM LEAVING WHITESIDE UNMARKED WITH THE BALL, WITH TIME TO SPARE HE LAID IT ON FOR TUTTILL WHO CRASHED THE BALL HOME WITH THE HELP ON THE WAY OF A DEFLECTION GOING INTO THE BREAK 1-0 UP CITY LOOKED CAPABLE OF ADDING MORE AGAINST A HAKOAH SIDE INTENT ON DEFENDING. ONE MINUTE INTO THE SECOND HALF ADDED THEIR 2ND AND FINAL GOAL WHEN BUCHANAN WENT DOWN THE RIGHT AGAIN AND 'SKINNED' TWO OPPONENTS AFTER TAKING THE BALL AS FAR AS HE COULD HE KNOCKED THE BALL INTO THE MIDDLE BUT A HAKOAH PLAYER REACHED THE BALL FIRST BUT MADE A HASH OF HIS CLEARANCE SENDING IT STRAIGHT TO TUTTILL WHO WASTED NO TIME IN THRASHING A 8 METRE

LEFT FOOT VOLLEY WHICH GAVE THE KEEPER NO CHANCE. AFTER THE GOAL HAKOAH CAME OUT OF THEIR SHELL BUT COULDN'T FIND A WAY THROUGH CITY'S DEFENCE SUPERBLY MARSHALLED BY STEWART.

SO CITY EARNED ANOTHER TWO POINTS WHICH SHOULD SEE THEM GET AWAY FROM THE RELEGATION ZONE.



THE RESERVES TRAVELLED TO PROBABLY THE MOST INEPT NAMED PLACE IN AUSTRALIA, SUNSHINE WHICH CONJURES UP VISIONS OF WARMTH AND FRIENDLYNESS.

LAST SATURDAY AFTERNOON IT WAS THE COMPLETE OPPOSITE, COOL WEATHER AND OPPONENTS WHO MUST ENDURE SAS TACTICS IN TRAINING, AS IT WAS QUITE OBUICUS FROM THE START OF THE MATCH THE MOTTO WAS 'IF IT MOVES KICK IT AND NO PRISONERS TO BE TAKEN.'

AS A SPECTACLE THE MATCH WAS REASONABLY ENTERTAINING AGAINST THE ALBION ROVERS. GOOD ASPECTS ABOUT FRANKSTON CITY'S TEAM WERE: SUPRISINGLY YOUNG TEAM, ALWAYS TRYING TO PLAY CONTROLLED SOCCER RIGHT FROM THEIR OWN PENALTY AREA, ALSO THE VERY GOOD RETURN TO FORM OF NIGEL BENT IN GOAL.

FRANKSTON WON THE MATCH QUITE CONVINCINGLY BY 4 GOALS TO ONE.

CITY'S GOALS CAME FROM BILLY FERGADIOTIS, TWO PENALTIES, MARTIN PARK, A SHASHING SHOT FROM JUST INSIDE THE BOX, AND ROBBIE READER, A FIERCE DRIVE ON THE EDGE OF THE PENALTY AREA.

ALBIONS SCHE REPLY CAME FROM ANOTHER PENALTY WHEN A CITY DEFENDER WENT OVER THE TOP OF A ROVERS FORWARD.

ON A SUNNY BUT WINDSWEPT AFTERNOON CITY PLAYED HOST TO THE HIGHLY PLACED JUVENTUS AT CENTENARY PARK. AFTER LOSING THE TOSS CITY WERE FORCED TO PLAY WITH THE WIND IN THEIR FACES AND WOULD COUNT THEMSELVES LUCKY TO HOLD JUVE TILL HALF-TIME WHICH THEY DID THANKS TO SUPERB DEFENDING LED BY THE UNCOMPROMISING WRIGHT.
