COLUMN

Now the season is well underway, we find ourselves with a battle on our hands to maintain our challenge for the top positions. We will not know for some weeks how the league is really shaping, but it appears that this Division Four is going to be very close indeed. At this juncture it is very difficult to say who will be heading or trailing by the halfway stage. Our four draws in the first five games (three of these away) have kept us in touch, and an odd goal in any of these three would have seen us in contact with the top three.

Our young side continues to develop, however, and if our policies are proven correct we will achieve results and future promise. I feel we have a great deal to give and that good results are not far away.

EXPERIENCE

The Reserve team continues to improve also and positive results will be gained soon. The most important factor here is that some of the junior players are getting very valuable experience playing and training with the senior players.

Good results over the next three or four matches could see us making a very definite challenge.
